## RECIPES

### DATE PALM JAGGERY RICE PUDDING

- PronitaNath (2nd Sem)

#### INGREDIENTS:

Short grain rice 1-cup (Gobindo Bhog), Whole milk- 2 cups, Heavy cream- 3 cups, Green cardamoms – 4, Dry bay leaf- 1, Handful raisins, Handful cashews, Date palm jaggery 6 to 7 tbsp (depends on how sweet you prefer the pudding)

#### DIRECTION:

1. Wash the rice and soak it in water for about 30 minutes.
2. In another small bowl, soak the raisins.
3. In a thick heavy bottom pan, pour milk and heavy cream. Drop the bay leaf and bring the milk to boil. Keep stirring in between. Now, let it simmer at medium low heat for about 15 minutes or until the milk thickens a bit
4. Drain the rice and pour it in the saucepan. Continue cooking in medium low heat, stirring occasionally.
5. After about 10 minutes or so, the rice should be half cooked. Add the jaggery at this point along with roughly crushed green cardamom and continue cooking at medium low heat, stirring occasionally.
6. Once the rice gets softened and the milk thickens, add cashews and raisins. Mix it well. If you prefer a thinner pudding, add more milk and cook for one more minute.
7. If you prefer cool pudding, allow it to reach room temperature before placing it in the refrigerator.

#### Notes:

1. You can use any other type of jaggery, but the flavor and taste will differ a lot
2. If at any point you feel that the pudding got too thick and the rice is still uncooked, pour some more milk (preferably warm) and continue cooking
3. Never add raisins in the beginning as it might curdle the milk. Always add them at the end. Use soaked raisins. ■

### GREEN PEAS KEBAB

#### INGREDIENTS:

1. Green Peas -1 cup (frozen), 2. Onion-1 cup (finely chopped), 3. Green Chilli-1/4 cup (chopped), 4. Garlic -5 flakes, 5. Lime Juice-2 tsp, 6. Ginger- 1 (medium size), 7. Cashew Nuts - 12 pieces (grounded), 8. Chopped Coriander -2 tbsp, 9. Rice flour- 2 tsp, 10. Chickpea flour-2 tsp, 11. Salt-according to taste, 12. Oil

#### METHOD:

1. Wash green peas and drain all the water. Green peas should be completely dried before proceeding further.
  2. Put green chillies, ginger and garlic into the food processor and make a fine paste. Add cashew powder to this paste.
  3. Now put green peas to the food processor and make a coarse paste.
  4. Mix well both the paste prepared.
  5. Add salt, chopped onions, coriander, rice-flour, chick pea flour and lime juice. Mix it well.
  6. Divide the paste into equal parts and make any shape of your choice, for instance, cylindrical shape.
  7. Roll the stuff on crushed corn flakes or bread crumbs.
  8. Take a pan, add oil. After the oil gets heated, fry the stuff till its colour changes to golden brown.

### THE KITE RUNNER

Khaled Hosseine's stunning debut novel is a gripping and emotional story of betrayal and redemption. It tells the story of eloquent Afghan version of American immigrant, Amir, in the late 20th Century. The story is set against the backdrop of tumultuous events from the fall of Afghanistan's monarchy through the Soviet military intervention, the exodus of refugees to Pakistan and the United States and the rise of Taliban regime.

As a boy, Amir cravenly betrays his servant and best friend, the Hazara boy Hassan. When the Russians come, Amir and his father were forced to flee to America, where Amir becomes a successful writer. But when Amir learns that a childhood mentor is ailing back home, he returns to discover that his relationship to Hassan had been deeper than he realized. The Kite runner becomes the story of Amir's quest for redemption- righting the wrongs he committed all those years ago as a boy. This leads him on a hazardous journey to rescue and adopt Hassan's son, whose father the Taliban has executed.

The brilliantly constructed literary piece by Hosseini shows the graphical description of extreme cruelty and violence, homosexual rape, murders, betrayals and the suicide attempt. The moving novel deals with religion, prejudices, forgiveness and the nature of goodness.

The novel derives its name from Afghan custom of kite fighting. The story ends well with optimism note on Afghanistan's future. ■

## BANNING OF MOBILE PHONES IN EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS

### ACTUARIES

Actuaries analyze the financial costs of risk and uncertainty. A career in this field involves application of mathematics, statistical knowledge, skill in risk assessment, and evaluation of financial products such as insurance and investments. Traditional responsibilities of Actuaries in life and general insurance business include designing and pricing of policies, monitoring the adequacy of the funds to provide the promised benefits, recommending fair rate of bonus where applicable, ensuring solvency margin, valuation of the insurance business and other insurance risks like legal liability, loss of profit, etc. They also define the risk factors, advise on the premium to be charged and re-insurance to be purchased, calculate reserve for outstanding claims and carry out financial modelling. But, now the scope of the functions and duties of an Actuary has increased considerably.

Actuaries in the insurance industry typically specialize in a specific field of insurance, such as Health insurance, Life insurance, General insurance, Reinsurance. Some actuaries apply their expertise to financial matters outside of the insurance industry. For example, Pension and retirement benefits actuaries, Enterprise risk actuaries. Some actuaries become consultants and provide advice to clients on a contractual basis. Many consulting actuaries audit the work of internal actuaries at insurance companies or handle actuarial duties for insurance companies that are not large enough to keep their own actuaries on staff. The role that an actuary can perform in each of these sectors can be quite varied, such as product pricing, financial modelling, valuations, risk management, carrying out peer reviews, designing social security schemes, advise on the premium to be charged etc.

Duties of Actuaries: Actuaries typically do the following:

- Compile statistical data and other information for further analysis
- Estimate the probability and likely economic cost of an event such as death, sickness, an accident, or a natural disaster
- Design, test, and administer insurance policies, investments, pension plans, and other business strategies to minimize risk and maximize profitability
- Produce charts, tables, and reports that explain calculations and proposals
- Explain their findings and proposals to company executives, government officials, shareholders, and clients

Skills required: Mathematical acumen, computer skills, business awareness, ability to work in a team, analytical thinking skill, problem solving skills, writing and speaking skills.

In today's technological world, cellular phones have become an integral part of day-to-day life. People of all ages rely on them for both communication and entertainment. However, it's important for parents, teachers and students to understand the detrimental effects of cell phones in schools.

The essential prerequisite for growth is FOCUS and these mobile phones take us far away from it.

The justification for banning mobile phones in educational institutions can better be reinstated by the fact that Mobile Phones may lead to the following.

#### Cheating

Mobile phones are capable of more than just calling and texting. Students can easily gain Internet access through their phones during an exam.

#### Cyber bullying

Mobile phones can take pictures and videos, creating a trend called "cyber-bullying." Students may use their phones to embarrass their peers or teachers. For example, students may record school fights and post them online.

#### Texting

Texting in class has become a serious concern for educators. Students can't focus on the lesson if they are busy sending messages on their phones.

#### Distraction

Children, teens and even young adults are prone to distraction with cell phones. In the classroom and out of school, cell phones provide students an instant network of communication and entertainment. Inside the classroom, students are distracted from the lessons to text, play games and, if they are very daring, call other people. Cell phone ringers, alarms and ring tones disrupt the flow of lessons and the attention of every student in the room and the teacher.

Although the disadvantages of cell phones in schools are quite apparent, the decision to regulate or ban them is up to each school. Some institutions prohibited mobile phones and pagers near the turn of the century. Many schools allow the devices because of external pressure from parents who claim that cell phones are important for emergency communication. National School Safety and Security Services recommends that only teachers and staff carry cell phones for use during a crisis.

## Mind Updates

- ▶ Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated the National War Memorial in Delhi: - Inaugurated on February 25, 2019, it spreads over 40 acres in the India Gate complex, by lighting the flame positioned at the bottom of the stone-made obelisk. Drawing inspiration from the "Chakravyuh" formation, the iconic memorial boasts of four thematic concentric circles with a tall ceremonial obelisk at its centre that will bear the eternal flame. A senior defense official said the project has been executed at a cost of Rs 176 crores and its design was selected through a global competition. The national soldiers' memorial is a symbol of the nation's gratitude to those men who made the supreme sacrifice after we gained Independence.
- ▶ Sensex rallies 342 points, Nifty tops 10,800; IT, bank stocks soar: - Besides, other Asian markets scaling a five-month high and a higher opening of European shares after US President Donald Trump announced extension of the March 1 deadline for increasing tariff on import of Chinese products, as talks between the two sides were making "substantial progress", too boosted investor sentiment here.
- ▶ Adani group wins bid to operate five airports in latest privatisation drive :- Adanis were the highest bidder for Ahmedabad, Thiruvananthapuram, Lucknow, Mangaluru and Jaipur airports, an official said, adding the bid for the Guwahati airport will be opened on Tuesday.
- ▶ Pulwama attack: All you need to know about Jaish suspects arrested by UP ATS: - Shah Nawaz Ahmed Teli and Aqib Ahmed Malik were arrested by the Uttar Pradesh Anti-Terror Squad on February 23.
- ▶ GST Council meet: 5% tax to be levied on under-construction properties, 1% on affordable housing: The Goods and Services Tax Council on Sunday approved the proposal for lowering the tax rate on real estate projects. For under-construction properties, the GST rate has been cut to 5 per cent from 12 per cent earlier. On the other hand, the tax rate on affordable housing projects will be levied at 1 per cent. However, developers won't be able to claim input tax credit (ITC), Finance Minister Arun Jaitley said. ■
