

ABOUT US

The little sapling of G.S. Lohia Girls' College that was planted by Lohia family and some social workers of Tinsukia (Under Shree Kanya Pathshala Trust) in the year 1996 has grown to be a big tree giving shade and nourishment of knowledge and life lessons, along with co-curricular excellence. In Tinsukia town, the atmosphere hits you with a blast of hot air from the streets, hustle bustle everywhere, vehicles exhaling obnoxious fumes, supermarkets, sundry shops, vendors and street hawkers, everything makes you feel exhausted, but in midst of all this impaired by the noisy environment, this place holds a distinctive aura due to the presence of the holy temple that makes the whole atmosphere, with excited voices and peals of laughter of the students.

The Institution has gradually grown across the years adding many golden feathers. It has always been the premier institution for female students, willing to pursue higher education in commerce. It is the first self financed college under Dibrugarh University.

Since the establishment of the college our students are regularly securing ranks in Dibrugarh University. Till now 26 batches of graduates have come out from our college and 15 times our students secured the First Rank under Dibrugarh University from 1999 to 2025. It has been possible only because of hard work and dedication of students along with the teaching faculty. All the teaching faculties of the college are well qualified, experienced and dedicated. The teaching staff are also ably supported by our management. Classes engaged by the Governing Body member CA Shree Ram Agarwal are looked upon enthusiastically by the students. Support of CA Shashi Bhushan Goel is also worth mentioning who time to time visit our college as a visiting faculty.

Our college also started M.Com (Centre for Distance and Online Education, Dibrugarh University) in the year 2005, with only five students. But, in the short span of time our college became the most preferred institution for M.Com (under distance education) for the female students. Though M.Com course offered by us is under Distance Education, we are providing regular classes to the students along with library facility.

Initially, our college started in the premises of Budding Buds Senior Secondary School, but in the year 2010 it was shifted to its own skillfully architected building named 'Lopa Mundra'. We can now boast of large classroom with excellent public addressing system facilities, ICT enabled teaching by way of projectors and Smart boards and Air Conditioners for comfort and ease. A well-stocked library cum computer room with Internet is also available for students and faculty. We also have an efficient medical unit and an infirmary for immediate medical attention. Moreover, the recently built state of art auditorium has been proficiently designed with an excellent acoustic system and has a capacity of holding populous audience with the provision of balcony enabling a vista view.

Our College stands as a trend setter in quality education. It believes that the true potentials of such students cannot be realized through academics alone. The students need to be provided with opportunities for exploring and enhancing their talents in extra-curricular activities as well. INFRASTRUCTURE

CCTV SURVEILLANCE

It becomes easier for College authorities to ensure discipline, peace and order in every corner of the campus. It helps to combat unacceptable behaviours and renders a sense of security.

SOLAR PANEL

College runs on solar power self generated by a set up of 216 Solar Panels. It generates 40 KW Power during the day sufficient to keep the Campus powered. The power input and output is adjusted through the electricity supply of ASEB.

100% POWER BACK UP

There is a generator of 62 KW Power during power failures and bad weather conditions.



WI-FI AND BROAD BAND

The Campus is Wi-Fi enabled. The students however, have restricted usage allowed. Campus has Broad Band connectivity for all computers supported by Static IP 2MBPS.

ICT ENABLED CLASSROOMS

G. S. Lohia College strive to stay updated technologically. All classrooms have 86 inch Smart Interactive Flat Panel (Smart board) to enable -

- Easier note taking by clear display and repetitions of slides
- Facilitates greater teaching versatility
- Allows better student presentations

FULLY AIR CONDITIONED CLASSROOMS-

It provides a conducive and comfortable environment where in the students are unperturbed by the changing weather conditions.

OUTDOOR SPORTS

The College provides multifarious opportunities of learning and participating in various outdoor sports - Throw Ball, Basket Ball, Kho Kho, Kabaddi, Athletics etc., under the guidance of efficient sports trainers.

INDOOR SPORTS

There is an indoor sports room with national level set ups for Carrom Board and Chess.

IQAC ROOM

There is a well-furnished Conference Room accommodating around 20 people with the sound system, projector, computer system with scanner and printer to facilitate panel discussions. The room is further sub divided by cabins for various Cells.

STUDENTS' COMMON ROOM

It has been marked with an informality of students' creative expression to make them feel at home.

MUSIC AND DANCE STUDIO

Students with interest in playing musical instruments, singing and dancing have a Studio for their sessions of practice and jamming. A group of students formed a College Band- Ethereal and the culture continues with the fresh talents joining the Ethereal every year.

CANTEEN

Students have access to canteen in the college where healthy and hygienic food is available at affordable rates.

AUDITORIUM

Auditorium has been proficiently designed with an excellent acoustic system and has a capacity of holding populous audience with the provision of balcony enabling a vista view. The jewel in the crown is PANASONIC MEGA DISPLAY THEATRE SIZE PROJECTOR. There is a premium projector installed which is first of its kind in North East. It is a multipurpose gadget for movies, presentations and behind the stage displays.

We have a well furnished and fully equipped library meeting the needs of students and teachers alike. We have Software for University Libraries (SOUL) 2.0 installed in our library for integrated library management.


