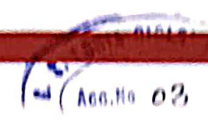

Google's new app seeks to promote Indian language content:

With its Next Billion Users initiative, it's more than apparent that Google has its eyes on India. Now, the tech giant is looking to promote India's vernacular languages. On August 28, Google launched the Navlekha app that aims to get Indian language publishers and their content online.

HRD Ministry introduces Atal ranking for institutions to promote innovation:

To promote a culture of innovation and research in higher education in India, the Union government has introduced Atal Ranking of Institutions on Innovation Achievements (ARIIA), Union HRD Minister Prakash Javadekar announced today. The HRD Minister made the announcement at the inauguration of an innovation cell at the All India Council of Technical Education (AICTE) in New Delhi.

India likely to replace UK as world's fifth-largest economy:

India is likely to surpass the UK to become the world's fifth largest economy next year on growing consumption and strong economic activity, Finance Minister Arun Jaitley said today. "This year...we have overtaken France. Next year we are likely to overtake Britain. Therefore, we will be the fifth largest (economy)," he said while inaugurating the office building of Competition Commission India (CCI).

Rupee hits fresh record-low of 70.82; drops 23p against USD:

Continuing its free-fall, the Rupee today weakened by another 23p against the US Dollar to trade at a lifetime-low of 70.82 on strong month-end demand for the USD amid sustained foreign fund outflows. At the Interbank Foreign Exchange (Forex) market, the Rupee opened a tad higher at 70.57 a USD from its previous close of 70.59 but slipped to hit 70.82, down by 23p.

India's gender pay gap has narrowed, informality is soaring:

The International Labor Organization (ILO) recently released its India Wage Report, and there are both positives and negatives to take from it. On one hand, the report revealed that while women continue to earn considerably less than men, the gender pay gap in India has narrowed. On the other hand, the report detailed alarming levels of informality and segmentation in jobs. ■

MOJITO MOCKTAIL

STOCK BROKING

Do you passionately follow the markets? Have a knack for handling finances? Then a career in stock broking might just be for you.

With the market in India growing steadily, it is obvious that those who deal in market shares are going to have rewarding careers with vast opportunities for growth. A career in share market might be a very good option indeed.

In layman words, Stock exchanges are like market places where stock brokers buy and sell securities for individuals or institutions.

So what does a Stock Broker do?

Stock brokers are involved in buying and selling of stocks in the market, mainly for their clients. They always remain in touch with their clients, constantly updating them about the fluctuations in the market and advise them when to buy & sell and at what rates. At the same time, stock brokers also ensure that their stock trading company also makes maximum profit in the long run.

The National Stock Exchange or NSE and Bombay Stock Exchange or BSE provides nationwide facilities with access to investors all over the country. The automated, screen-based trading system using state-of-the-art technology makes market operations transparent.

The minimum qualification required to become a stock broker is graduation with at least two years of experience in stock broking firm. A sub-broker (the previous stage of being a broker) needs to have passed 12th standard to be eligible for this job.

Although there aren't any stock broking courses, NCFM and NISM are online testing and certification program offered by National Stock Exchange of India. It's suitable for beginners in Stock market who want to learn and evaluate their skills. There are many beginner, mid-level and advanced modules available ranging across all areas of Capital markets. It's a good alternative to international certifications like CMT and CFA which require a hefty certification fee. Though these certifications are not recognized internationally, yet they are very useful to assess and expand your knowledge.

Career in financial markets (particularly stock markets) can thus be considered very lucrative these days. It has actually become a mainstream career option for fresh college pass-outs as well as veterans who wish to change their job profile. ■
